Fish Fry Dinners are Opportunities to Serve The Lord with Gladness

My heart is filled with joy at how many people volunteered to help with our Friday Fish Fry Dinners at Messiah. They begin again starting Friday, February 24 and continue for six weeks, running from 5-7pm.

This is the one outreach service event I have missed since they were cancelled at the beginning of the Pandemic back in March of 2020.

Since then, we have started a Food Pantry which is staffed with 15 + volunteers. Many of whom have helped in the past at the Fish Fry Dinners. So, wisely, the Evangelism Committee did not want to commit to six weeks of serving without a lot of new volunteers.

Well with prayer, and some fasting, God's will prevailed. The surveys were an overwhelming expression of God's love. This was shown in the number of people (many of whom are new) that want to assist in making these dinners as occasions for stronger fellowship among our members, and an opportunity to meet new people.

Our number 1 goal in hosting these dinners is NOT getting as many people as possible to our Fellowship Hall to dine. No doubt that is very important as we all work to promote these dinners.

Our number 1 goal is to work together so that ALL our volunteers have a positive experience in serving the Lord at Messiah. That involves all of us exhibiting an incredible amount of patience as we all work for quick listening, slow speaking, and abounding love. Satan would love nothing better than for us to gossip and back bite. He wants descensions in the ranks. But, with the Lord guiding us, let's not give the Evil One that chance. Let's serve the Lord in gladness as Psalm 100:2 states.

Good Fellowship is not just great coffee hours between Sunday services or Wednesday Midweek Advent or Lenten Suppers. Good fellowship includes confessing unity in our faith we have in Christ through His Word. We express this in our Liturgy, Creeds, and at the Communion Rail. Then from this, we work together in joy serving the Lord shown in acts of love in His Church and to our community. It is the ways we honor what Jesus suffered and died to give us at the Cross as we live His victory over the grave.

988 LIFELINE

As of July 16, 2022, anyone in the United States can call or text 988 or use an online chat tool to access the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline. The name of the service will be changing to the 988 Suicide & Crisis Lifeline.

The new 988 service will accept calls, texts, and online chats from anyone who needs support for a suicidal, mental health, and/or substance use crisis. People can also contact 988 if they are concerned about a loved one in crisis. Wisconsinites who use 988 will connect with Wisconsin Lifeline.

Easy Baked Pork Chops

IIngredients

- 6 thick cut pork chops
- · 1 teaspoon garlic powder
- · 1 teaspoon seasoning salt
- 2 egg, beaten
- ¼ cup all-purpose flour
- · 2 cups Italian-style seasoned bread crumbs
- · 4 tablespoons olive oil
- 1 (10.5 ounce) can condensed cream of mushroom soup
- ½ cup milk
- ⅓ cup white wine

Directions

- 1. Preheat the oven to 350 degrees.
- 2. Season pork chops with garlic powder and seasoning salt. Place beaten eggs in a small bowl. Dredge pork chops lightly in flour; dip into beaten egg, then press into breadcrumbs to coat both sides.
- 3. Heat oil in a medium skillet over medium-high heat. Add breaded pork chops and cook until golden brown, about 5 minutes per side; transfer to a 9x13-inch baking dish and cover with foil.
- 4. Bake in the preheated oven for 1 hour. Meanwhile, mix condensed soup, milk, and white wine in a medium bowl until well combined; pour soup mixture over pork chops. Replace the foil and continue to bake for another 30 minutes.




What Do We Believe
