Blessings Facing the Storms of Life

After the last Fish Fry on Friday, March 31st, six attenders were huddled in our storm shelter at Messiah, as the Tornado Sirens were blaring in Beloit.

I was among the people there and I thank God. If I would have risked going home during the storm, I would have encountered a tornado coming within 15 feet of my house. At our home, the twister took out by the root a 60 foot, 100-year-old oak tree and pushed it into the power lines next to our house knocking out power. The twister also took out two power poles.

The tornado then made a beeline toward our next-door neighbors' oak tree twisting it like a pretzel, dropping the tree on their garage, demolishing it, and severely damaging their home. Thank the Lord no one was home.

All this reminded me of how quickly life can change. It also reinforced how the Lord gets us through the storms of life.

"Humble yourselves before the Lord, and he will exalt you," James 4:10 ESV.

Part of facing any test to the faith is humility. Being without power for 23 hours makes you better appreciate heat and electricity. My wife made a fire in our fireplace, and used up the rest of our firewood to keep our home a warm 59 degrees while it was freezing outside.


At times, we are not grateful for God's blessings till they are withheld from us and are even more thankful when they return.

And sometimes we are not more appreciative of the people we love until they are here no more. I think of members Rick Magee and Patty Wetzel who passed in March without much notice. But they are a testimony to treasure good health any day.

See you in worship, fellowship, and service.



Lemon Icebox Pie

IIngredients

4/9

FOR THE CRUST:

- 11/2 c. graham cracker crumbs
- · 2 tbsp. granulated sugar
- 7 tbsp. salted butter, melted

FOR THE FILLING:

- 214-oz. cans sweetened condensed milk
- 1 c. fresh lemon juice (from about 6 lemons)
- 5 large egg yolks
- 1 tbsp. lemon zest
- 1 c. heavy cream
- 2 tbsp. powdered sugar
- 1/2 tsp. vanilla extract

Directions

- 1. For the crust: Preheat the oven to 350°. Combine the cracker crumbs, sugar, and butter in a medium bowl. Mix with a fork until the crumbs are well coated and stick together when pinched. Press the mixture into the bottom and up the sides of a 9-inch pie plate. Bake until set, about 10 minutes. Set aside to cool slightly, about 10 minutes.
- 2. For the filling: Whisk together the condensed milk, lemon juice, egg yolks, and lemon zest in a medium bowl until combined. Pour the filling into the crust and bake until the center is set but still slightly jiggly, about 15 minutes. Let cool for 30 minutes, then refrigerate until chilled, about 2 hours.
- 3. Before serving, beat the heavy cream, powdered sugar, and vanilla in a large bowl with a mixer on medium speed until soft peaks form. Dollop on the center of the pie and serve.
