GREETINGS FROM PASTOR DAN

Celebrating 15 year as Pastor with a Supportive Wife

I was totally surprised on Sunday, April 23 when Zach Anderson asked to speak at the end of the 9am service. He announced my 15th anniversary of being ordained as a pastor and presented me with gifts on behalf of the congregation.

It was a moment of gratitude and humility. I praise the Lord and thank you for the gifts of love. It is humbling to see how the Lord has worked in my life over the past decade and a half. I had not realized it had been 15 years until just days before my anniversary I, along with others, were recognized at the Spring District Pastors' Conference in Manitowoc. My how time has flown.

What I really thank Zach for is recognizing the role Berta plays in my ministry. When you, the congregation, called me in 2016 to be your under-shepherd you just called me, not my wife. However, Berta is not immune from the effects of this Office. She sees the joys and strains this position can have on me. She is awakened, too, in the middle of the night when a pastoral care emergency occurs. She has had to reschedule family activities when unexpected events at the church occur. Sometimes people want to discuss with her issues they have with me. Or expect her to relay messages when members need to talk to me directly.

My wife's role as the Pastor's wife is often hidden from the rest of the congregation but very vivid to the Lord. She is the one who offers me a perspective on life no one else can. She can offer critiques on sermons and Bible Studies that are enormously helpful. I can't tell you how many times that has prevented me from making some pretty foolish decisions.

A pastor's wife should not be expected to be on committees or even be the most active member of the congregation. She is uniquely called to support me as a pastor and husband, so that my life in Christ is put into perspective. That means she is the one who says it's time to take a break. She is the one who helps me see that life is more than being a pastor. She is the one who works to balance my faith life with our Lord.

So, thank you, Berta, for all you have done for me and for the Lord these past 15 plus years. Your love and support are much appreciated.






As a result, \$1600 was raised for mission efforts, of which \$250 has already been donated to Capstone Ministries.
