## **GREETINGS FROM PASTOR DAN**

#### Vision for a Growing Congregation

This past August 28 marked my 7th Anniversary being installed as Pastor here at Messiah Lutheran Church. My, how time has flown since 2016, but praise be to God our congregation has grown numerically and spiritually.

The Lord has blessed us to perform 32 baptisms where 11 of those were adults. We have seen 48 additional adult confirmations on top of the 6 confirmed the traditional way.

We have celebrated the eternal life of 30 members who have gone to their heavenly home as we said goodbye at funerals and memorial services.

During the past 7 years, our average weekly worship attendance has gone from 74 to 105, dipping during the Pandemic to a low of 66 but increasing every year since 2021.

During that time our Sunday School has increased in both students and teachers. We began again VBS. We've added a Children's Handbell Choir, hosted a myriad of Fish Fry and other community dinners, and have done other community outreach events, including Animal Blessings services. We started a Food Pantry ministry and expanded it. We began streaming services and offering audio CDs. We began again our Messenger newsletters.

Along the way we've celebrated our 60th anniversary as a congregation and revived our website, published a pictorial directory, and are ready to do that again.

Praise the Lord how He has worked through us, and how we have worked together to celebrate these blessings. "We," "our" and "us" are the strongest pronouns in the church when Jesus and the Gospel are at the center of our ministry. The worst pronouns for a church are "they," "their," and "them." God's Word shows us "we" is a stronger way to walk together in Christ with a unified faith.

So, as we embark on a Post Pandemic future the question becomes where do "we" want to be as a congregation in the next 5 years or 10 years? Where do we need to grow as a congregation, numerically and spiritually. Where is the Lord leading us in reaching out to our community and how? Where is the Lord providing us time, talents, and treasurers to support this vision?

This is the time to ask our God to give us a vision of where He wants us to be. There will be opportunities soon to do more self-reflection on these questions. We do not want to let the world scare us into retreat. "They" are not our enemy. Satan, sin, and eternal condemnation are. "They" are the "they" that divide. We are called to love those who don't have faith in Christ. We are called to keep those

who have faith in the church. How is the Lord calling us to do so? Pray, study God's Word, meditate, contemplate, listen, discern, and decide. And then watch how the Lord blesses us. We can count on Jesus to do so.

## Macaroni & Cheese Soup



#### Ingredients

- 6 dunces dry elbow macaroni, about 1 1/2 cups
- 4 tablespoons butter
- cup all-purpose flour
- · 6 cups low-sodium chicken broth
- 12 ounces sharp or extra-sharp cheddar cheese, shredded (about 3 cups)
- · 2 cups milk, 2% or whole, warmed
- 1/2 cup grated Parmesan cheese
- 1 tablespoon tomato paste
- 1 teaspoon dry mustard powder
- 1/2 teaspoon garlic powder
- 1/4 teaspoon onion powder
- Salt & freshly ground black pepper, to taste
- 6 slices bacon, cooked until crispy and diced or crumbled

#### Directions

- Set a medium pot of salted water over high heat and bring to a boil. Stir in the macaroni and cook according to package directions. Drain and set aside.
- In the meantime, set a large pot over medium heat. Melt butter. Use a whisk to stir in flour, whisking continuously until light golden brown, about 2 minutes. Continue to whisk while slowly and gradually adding broth. Increase heat to medium high and bring to a boil. Cook while whisking until the sauce is smooth and thickened, between 5 to 10 minutes.
- Remove pot from heat. Add grated cheddar, ½ cup at a time, stirring until completely melted and smooth before adding more. Once all cheese has been incorporated and cheese sauce is smooth, stir in milk, cooked macaroni, Parmesan, tomato paste, mustard powder, garlic powder, onion powder, and salt and pepper, to taste. Serve immediately with diced bacon sprinkled on top.

#### **Synodical Convention Report**

68<sup>th</sup> Regular Convention of The Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod Report

Here are some highlights from the recent Synodical Convention with Lay Elder-Deacon Garrett Cook attending representing our Circuit as a Lay Delegate. The Rev Andrew Harris of Christ in Clinton was our pastoral delegate.

- A resolution was passed regarding in-person communion. Pastors and congregations are urged to gather in-person to celebrate the Lord's Supper and to refrain from online Communion.
- A resolution was passed regarding encouraging in-person corporate worship. It calls
  upon pastors and congregations to "uphold the Third Commandment by gathering
  together weekly for worship" and to prioritize "in-person, embodied corporate worship."
- A resolution was passed regarding to encourage appropriate use of social media. This
  offers guidance on the use of social media for the church. It also acknowledges the
  benefit that social media can have for the church, but also pointed to the many evils
  exacerbated by incorrect use of this technology. With this being adopted, church
  workers will be held to a higher standard.
- A resolution was passed regarding to affirm and strengthen the Synod's commitment to
  well-formed clergy for the sake of the gospel. This resolution adopts that the SMP route
  be utilized only for its intended purposes according to Bylaw 2.13.1 and that the
  residential Master of Divinity route at our Synod seminaries continue to be positioned
  and understood as the Synod's strongly preferred route to ordination.
- A series of resolutions were passed regarding to recognize alter and pulpit fellowship
  with several Lutheran Churches in other countries. Evangelical Lutheran Mission Diocese
  of Finland, Lutheran Church of Uganda, Evangelical Lutheran Church of Ukraine. Bishop
  Serge Maschewski addressed the assembly and presented President Harrison with a
  helmet purchased, along with others and with flak jackets, for the pastors of his church
  by the LCMS Office of International Mission, which saved his life in a rocket attack and
  then that of a colleague as well.

The convention was held at the Baird Center in Milwaukee from Saturday, July 29 through Thursday, August 3. Over 7000 were in attendance. Pastor Dan volunteered one day at the convention helping people find where they needed to go.
