Fruit of the Spirit: Gentleness

PRELUDE

WORSHIP THEME: Lent is a time of internal reflection on our lives: our thoughts, words, and deeds. You look inwardly to see the real you, and to have the Word of God help you focus on better ways to live more obedient lives for Christ's glory.

"Dining on the Fruit of Spirit." We continue to explore 9 characteristics that make up the Fruit of the Holy Spirit mentioned in Galatians 5:22-23. These are how the Holy Spirit is working in us to be more like Jesus. Tonight, you will receive a fruit tree and a piece of fruit to put on that tree.

This week, we explore the Holy Spirit's Fruit of Gentleness. Often this trait is seen as weak. In fact other words used to describe gentleness in the dictionary are "docile," "delicate," and "soft." But gentleness in the biblical sense is not those. In fact, it is the opposite. It has more of the idea of a "harnessed strength." What exactly is that? And how can you live Christ's harnessed strength in a world where it seems those with the most power have control over you? May the Holy Spirit through His Word help you tonight to possess Christ's powerful gentleness for your life.

Bible Verse for Lent: James 1:12 NIV

P: Blessed is the one who perseveres under trial because, having stood the test,

C: that person will receive the crown of life that the Lord has promised to those who love him.

P: God love you as you worship Him to persevere, being blessed with a stronger faith.

C: You made my feet like the feet of a deer and set me secure on the heights.

P: You train my hands for war, so that my arms can bend a bow of bronze.

C: You have given me the shield of your salvation, and your right hand supported me, and your gentleness made me great.

P: You gave a wide place for my steps under me, and my feet did not slip.

SCRIPTURE READING #1: Galatians 5:22-25 ESV

²² But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, ²³ gentleness, self-control; against such things there is no law. ²⁴ And those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires.

²⁵ If we live by the Spirit, let us also keep in step with the Spirit. ²⁶ Let us not become conceited, provoking one another, envying one another.

SCRIPTURE READING #2: 1 Timothy 6:6-12 ESV

⁶ But godliness with contentment is great gain, ⁷ for we brought nothing into the world, and we cannot take anything out of the world. ⁸ But if we have food and clothing, with these we will be content. ⁹ But those who desire to be rich fall into temptation, into a snare, into many senseless and harmful desires that plunge people into ruin and destruction. ¹⁰ For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evils. It is through this craving that some have wandered away from the faith and pierced themselves with many pangs.

¹¹ But as for you, O man of God, flee these things. Pursue righteousness, godliness, faith, love, steadfastness, gentleness. ¹² Fight the good fight of the faith. Take hold of the eternal life to which you were called and about which you made the good confession in the presence of many witnesses.

SCRIPTURE READING #3: Ephesians 4:1-6 ESV

¹ I therefore, a prisoner for the Lord, urge you to walk in a manner worthy of the calling to which you have been called, ² with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, ³ eager to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. ⁴ There is one body and one Spirit—just as you were called to the one hope that belongs to your call— ⁵ one Lord, one faith, one baptism, ⁶ one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all.

SCRIPTURE READING #4: Matthew 11:28-30 ESV

Jesus said: ²⁸ Come to me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. ²⁹ Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. ³⁰ For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light."

P: O Lord, have mercy on us.

C: Thanks be to God.

HOMILY: "Fruit of Gentleness: Harnessed Strength from Christ"

Text: Matthew 11:28-30


