Fruit of the Spirit: Self-Control

PRELUDE

WORSHIP THEME: Lent is a time of internal reflection on our lives: our thoughts, words, and deeds. You look inwardly to see the real you, and to have the Word of God help you focus on better ways to live more obedient lives for Christ's glory.

"Dining on the Fruit of Spirit." Tonight we conclude our 9 characteristics that make up the Fruit of the Holy Spirit mentioned in Galatians 5:22-23. These are how the Holy Spirit is working in us to be more like Jesus. You will receive the last piece of fruit to put on that tree.

This week, we explore the Holy Spirit's Fruit of Self-Control. We are tempted to take fleshy desires and give into them without any regard for the guardrails the Lord puts in place to keep us from trespassing, going where we shouldn't. Tonight, the Word of God will guide our restraint like a Shepherd Staff and Rod to offer us comfort and confidence as we face the desires of our bodies, minds, and spirits. May the Holy Spirit through His Word help you tonight to exercise self-control in showing that you're Christ's winner.

SCRIPTURE READING #1: Galatians 5:22-25 ESV

²² But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, ²³ gentleness, self-control; against such things there is no law. ²⁴ And those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires.

²⁵ If we live by the Spirit, let us also keep in step with the Spirit. ²⁶ Let us not become conceited, provoking one another, envying one another.

SCRIPTURE READING #2: 1 Corinthians 9:24-27 ESV

²⁴ Do you not know that in a race all the runners run, but only one receives the prize? So run that you may obtain it. ²⁵ Every athlete exercises self-control in all things. They do it to receive a perishable wreath, but we an imperishable. ²⁶ So I do not run aimlessly; I do not box as one beating the air. ²⁷ But I discipline my body and keep it under control, lest after preaching to others I myself should be disqualified.

SCRIPTURE READING #3: 2 Timothy 3:1-5 ESV

¹ But understand this, that in the last days there will come times of difficulty. ² For people will be lovers of self, lovers of money, proud, arrogant, abusive, disobedient to their parents, ungrateful, unholy, ³ heartless, unappeasable, slanderous, without self-control, brutal, not loving good, ⁴ treacherous, reckless, swollen with conceit, lovers of pleasure rather than lovers of God, ⁵ having the appearance of godliness, but denying its power. Avoid such people.

SCRIPTURE READING #4: 2 Peter 1:1-9 ESV

¹ Simeon Peter, a servant and apostle of Jesus Christ,

To those who have obtained a faith of equal standing with ours by the righteousness of our God and Savior Jesus Christ:

P: O Lord, have mercy on us.

C: Thanks be to God.

HOMILY: "Exercising Self-Control: To Show You're Christ's Winner"

Texts: 1 Corinthians 9:24-27 and 2 Peter 1:1-9
