# Good Friday Night Divine Worship Friday of the Passion March 29, 2024

## The Battle of Good and Evil

FROM THE LAY ELDER-DEACONS: Welcome to Messiah. We want to make sure your worship experience goes well. So just as a reminder, please turn cellphones ringers off during worship. **HOLY WEEK SERVICES:** <u>Good Friday Tenebrae</u>: Three of the six hours Jesus hung on the cross were spent in total and complete darkness. *Tenebrae* is Latin for "darkness." Tonight the service starts in the light and ends in darkness to show God's judgment on humankind for their sins. Another way to describe this holy day is "Black Friday." But from the darkness of the day comes something very good. Yet we worship with a sense of somberness and humility.

**Worship Theme:** Tonight, we look at the narratives from the Gospel of Mark to frame this Good Friday as a battle of good and evil, light and dark, Jesus and Satan. We already know the outcome so why review the battle? The power of God's Word helps us better understand the depths, widths, and heights of what Jesus suffered and died to give us. God humbly bless you tonight, so this Easter Sunday has special meaning to your celebration of eternal life with Jesus.

O blessed Jesus, my sins alone put You on the cross. It is the evil I did that You died to take away. Tonight, show me why it is important that the Evil One had to be defeated to deliver us from him. ## PASSION NARRATIVE READING #1......Mark 15:1-5 ESV

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Jesus stands trial before Pilate.

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<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> And as soon as it was morning, the chief priests held a consultation with the elders and scribes and the whole council. And they bound Jesus and led him away and delivered him over

to Pilate. <sup>2</sup> And Pilate asked him, "Are you the King of the Jews?" And he answered him, "You have said so." <sup>3</sup> And the chief priests accused him of many things. <sup>4</sup> And Pilate again asked him, "Have you no answer to make? See how many charges they bring against you." <sup>5</sup> But Jesus made no further answer, so that Pilate was amazed.



## PASSION NARRATIVE READING #2......Mark 15:6-15 ESV

The releasing of criminal Barabbas for Jesus.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>6</sup> Now at the feast he (Pilate) used to release for them one prisoner for whom they asked. <sup>7</sup> And among the rebels in prison, who had committed murder in the insurrection, there was a man

called Barabbas. <sup>8</sup> And the crowd came up and began to ask Pilate to do as he usually did for them. <sup>9</sup> And he answered them, saying, "Do you want me to release for you the King of the Jews?" <sup>10</sup> For he perceived that it was out of envy that the chief priests had delivered him up. <sup>11</sup> But the chief priests stirred up the crowd to have him release for them Barabbas instead. <sup>12</sup> And Pilate again said to them, "Then what shall I do with the man you call the King of the Jews?" <sup>13</sup> And they cried out again, "Crucify him." <sup>14</sup> And Pilate said to them, "Why? What evil has he done?" But they shouted all the more, "Crucify him." <sup>15</sup> So Pilate, wishing to satisfy the crowd, released for them Barabbas, and having scourged Jesus, he delivered him to be crucified.

## PASSION NARRATIVE READING #3......Mark 15:16-20 ESV

Jesus is mocked, spat upon, and assaulted.

<sup>16</sup> And the soldiers led him (Jesus) away inside the palace (that is, the governor's headquarters), and they called together the whole battalion. <sup>17</sup> And they clothed him in a purple cloak, and twisting together a crown of thorns, they put it on him. <sup>18</sup> And they began to salute him, "Hail, King of the Jews!" <sup>19</sup> And they were striking his head with a reed and spitting on him and kneeling down in homage to him. <sup>20</sup> And when they had mocked him, they stripped him of the purple cloak and put his own clothes on him. And they led him out to crucify him.

## HYMN OF REFLECTION: "We sing the Praise of Him Who Died" RED 178 Verses 1-3 (for the notes)

- We sing the praise of Him who died, Of Him who died upon the cross; The sinner's Hope let all deride, For this we count the world but loss.
- Inscribed upon that cross we see In shining letters, "God is Love." He bears our sins upon the tree, He brings us mercy from above.

### PASSION NARRATIVE READING #4......Mark 15:21-32 ESV

Jesus is so weak He can not carry his own cross weighting somewhere between 30-100 pounds. He is nailed to the cross around 9am.

<sup>21</sup> And they compelled a passerby, Simon of Cyrene, who was coming in from the country, the father of Alexander and Rufus, to carry his cross. <sup>22</sup> And they brought him to the place called Golgotha (which means Place of a Skull). <sup>23</sup> And they offered him wine mixed with myrrh, but he did not take it. <sup>24</sup> And they crucified him and divided his garments among them, casting lots for them, to decide what each should take. <sup>25</sup> And it was the third hour when they crucified him. <sup>26</sup> And the inscription of the charge against him read, "The King of the Jews." <sup>27</sup> And with him they crucified two robbers, one on his right and one on his left. <sup>29</sup> And those who passed by derided him, wagging their heads and saying, "Aha! You who would destroy the temple and rebuild it in three days, <sup>30</sup> save yourself, and come down from the cross!" <sup>31</sup> So also the chief priests with the scribes mocked him to one another, saying, "He saved others; he cannot save himself. <sup>32</sup> Let the Christ, the King of Israel, come down now from the cross that we may see and believe." Those who were crucified with him also reviled him.

#### PASSION NARRATIVE READING #5......Mark 15:33-41 ESV

At Noon, darkness covered the Earth as judgment from God for the sins of humanity.

<sup>33</sup> And when the sixth hour had come, there was darkness over the whole land until the ninth hour. <sup>34</sup> And at the ninth hour Jesus cried with a loud voice, "Eloi, Eloi, lema sabachthani?" which means, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" <sup>35</sup> And some of the bystanders hearing it said, "Behold, he is calling Elijah." <sup>36</sup> And someone ran and filled a sponge with sour wine, put it on a reed and gave it to him to drink, saying, "Wait, let us see whether Elijah will come to take him down." <sup>37</sup> And Jesus uttered a loud cry and breathed his last. <sup>38</sup> And the curtain of the temple was torn in two, from top to bottom. <sup>39</sup> And when the centurion, who stood facing him, saw that in this way he breathed his last, he said, "Truly this man was the Son of God!"

<sup>40</sup> There were also women looking on from a distance, among whom were Mary Magdalene, and Mary the mother of James the younger and of Joses, and Salome. <sup>41</sup> When he was in Galilee, they followed him and ministered to him, and there were also many other women who came up with him to Jerusalem.

- 1. O dearest Jesus, what law hast Thou broken That such sharp sentence should on Thee be spoken? Of what great crime hast Thou to make confession--What dark transgression?
- 2. They crown Thy head with thorns, they smite, they scourge Thee; With cruel mockings to the cross they urge Thee; They give Thee gall to drink, they still decry Thee; They crucify Thee.

#### PASSION NARRATIVE READING #6......Mark 15:42-47 ESV

Jesus' grave is prepared by one of the few Sanhedrin who did not vote to have Jesus crucified.

<sup>42</sup> And when evening had come, since it was the day of Preparation, that is, the day before the Sabbath, <sup>43</sup> Joseph of Arimathea, a respected member of the council, who was also himself looking for the kingdom of God, took courage and went to Pilate and asked for the body of Jesus. <sup>44</sup> Pilate was surprised to hear that he should have already died. And summoning the centurion, he asked him whether he was already dead. <sup>45</sup> And when he learned from the centurion that he was dead, he granted the corpse to Joseph. <sup>46</sup> And Joseph bought a linen shroud, and taking him down, wrapped him in the linen shroud and laid him in a tomb that had been cut out of the rock. And he rolled a stone against the entrance of the tomb. <sup>47</sup> Mary Magdalene and Mary the mother of Joses saw where he was laid.


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

#### THE DARKNESS

As this solitary light returns, we accept it as a sign of the hope of Easter.


We leave the sanctuary in silence out of reverence for our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, and reflecting on the Passion of our Lord.
