Speaking Jesus' Language of Love!

Please bless me so I can repent of my sins, trusting more in Jesus Christ as my only Savior to grow in good works to glorify You. In Jesus' Name. Amen.

LITURGICAL SEASON: Pentecost was Jewish Holy Day observed 50 days after Passover. Now, Pentecost Sunday is celebrated 50 days after Christ's resurrection, celebrating the birth of the Church, almost 2000 years ago by the will of the Father at the direction of Jesus through the Holy Spirit. Today's color is red to symbolize the tongues of fire on the head of Jesus' Disciples.

WORSHIP THEME: Jews from all over the known world gathered in Jerusalem for the annual Pentecost celebration. What they were not expecting was Galilean Jews speaking in many native tongues. What they heard was the language of Jesus' love. While we may never possess this supernatural ability of the Holy Spirit, we can still speak to people the language of Jesus' love in ways that impact where they are in their lives today. This way we can show people the wonders of God as they struggle in an unlovable world. Today's sermon will show you how. **Jesus' love was bestowed Lisa Marie Barrett through the waters of Holy Baptism at the 9am service.**

P: Please take a moment to reflect on your life in Christ and where you have fallen short of His glory.

Moment of silence to meditate on the sins not brought before the Lord, using the following to guide your reflection: Considering the 10 Commandments think about your callings in life: spouse, parent, child, student, employer/employee, church member, etc.

- Have you been disobedient, unfaithful, or lazy?
- Have you been hot-tempered, rude, or quarrelsome?
- Have you hurt someone with your words and deeds?
- Have your thoughts, words or deeds revealed lust or greed?
- Have you stolen, been negligent, or wasted anything?

P: Let us now confess our sins publicly before God and each other. O Holy Father...

C: I confess that I have turned away from You and from my neighbors, and in toward myself. I have sought security in possessions and in the power of my personal relationships. Most of all, I have trusted in myself. O Lord, turn me back to You. In Your mercy, please forgive my sins of thoughts, words and deeds, both actions and inactions. Cleanse me from my guilt and shame. Guide me on the path of freedom that is Your gift to me by faith in Your Son, Jesus Christ, my Lord. Amen.

P: Hear for yourselves this comforting Word from God: There is no condemnation for those who have faith in Christ Jesus. In the waters of Holy Baptism, grace abounds for you who have been baptized. God turns to you in love and puts away every sin, every wrong turn, for the sake of Jesus, the One our Heavenly Father sent to save the world. With Him, there is true comfort and freedom. Therefore, as your called and ordained servant of God and only by the authority of Jesus Christ gives His Church, do I forgive you of all your sins, in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

SERVICE OF THE WORD

THE FIRST READING...... Acts 2:1-41 NIV

¹ When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. ² Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. ³ They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. ⁴ All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them.

⁵ Now there were staying in Jerusalem God-fearing Jews from every nation under heaven. ⁶ When they heard this sound, a crowd came together in bewilderment, because each one heard their own language being spoken. ⁷ Utterly amazed, they asked: "Aren't all these who are speaking Galileans? ⁸ Then how is it that each of us hears them in our native language? ⁹ Parthians, Medes and Elamites; residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, ¹⁰ Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya near Cyrene; visitors from Rome ¹¹ (both Jews and converts to Judaism); Cretans and Arabs—we hear them declaring the wonders of God in our own tongues!" ¹² Amazed and perplexed, they asked one another, "What does this mean?"

17 "'In the last days, God says,I will pour out my Spirit on all people.Your sons and daughters will prophesy,your young men will see visions,

¹³ Some, however, made fun of them and said, "They have had too much wine."

¹⁴ Then Peter stood up with the Eleven, raised his voice and addressed the crowd: "Fellow Jews and all of you who live in Jerusalem, let me explain this to you; listen carefully to what I say. ¹⁵ These people are not drunk, as you suppose. It's only nine in the morning! ¹⁶ No, this is what was spoken by the prophet Joel:

your old men will dream dreams.

- ¹⁸ Even on my servants, both men and women, I will pour out my Spirit in those days, and they will prophesy.
- ¹⁹ I will show wonders in the heavens above and signs on the earth below, blood and fire and billows of smoke.
- ²⁰ The sun will be turned to darkness and the moon to blood before the coming of the great and glorious day of the Lord.
- ²¹ And everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.'
- ²² "Fellow Israelites, listen to this: Jesus of Nazareth was a man accredited by God to you by miracles, wonders and signs, which God did among you through him, as you yourselves know. ²³ This man was handed over to you by God's deliberate plan and foreknowledge; and you, with the help of wicked men, put him to death by nailing him to the cross. ²⁴ But God raised him from the dead, freeing him from the agony of death, because it was impossible for death to keep its hold on him. ²⁵ David said about him:
- "'I saw the Lord always before me.

 Because he is at my right hand,
 I will not be shaken.
- ²⁶ Therefore my heart is glad and my tongue rejoices; my body also will rest in hope,
- ²⁷ because you will not abandon me to the realm of the dead, you will not let your holy one see decay.
- ²⁸ You have made known to me the paths of life; you will fill me with joy in your presence.'
- ²⁹ "Fellow Israelites, I can tell you confidently that the patriarch David died and was buried, and his tomb is here to this day. ³⁰ But he was a prophet and knew that God had promised him on oath that he would place one of his descendants on his throne. ³¹ Seeing what was to come, he spoke of the resurrection of the Messiah, that he was not abandoned to the realm of the dead, nor did his body see decay. ³² God has raised this Jesus to life, and we are all witnesses of it. ³³ Exalted to the right hand of God, he has received from the Father the promised Holy Spirit and has poured out what you now see and hear. ³⁴ For David did not ascend to heaven, and yet he said.

"The Lord said to my Lord:
"Sit at my right hand

35 until I make your enemies
a footstool for your feet."

- ³⁷ When the people heard this, they were cut to the heart and said to Peter and the other apostles, "Brothers, what shall we do?"
- ³⁸ Peter replied, "Repent and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins. And you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. ³⁹ The promise is for you and your children and for all who are far off—for all whom the Lord our God will call."
- ⁴⁰ With many other words he warned them; and he pleaded with them, "Save yourselves from this corrupt generation." ⁴¹ Those who accepted his message were baptized, and about three thousand were added to their number that day.

P: This is the Word of the Lord.

^{16:7} But very truly I tell you, it is for your good that I am going away. Unless I go away, the Advocate will not come to you; but if I go, I will send him to you. ⁸ When he comes, he will prove


³⁶ "Therefore let all Israel be assured of this: God has made this Jesus, whom you crucified, both Lord and Messiah."


the world to be in the wrong about sin and righteousness and judgment: ⁹ about sin, because people do not believe in me; ¹⁰ about righteousness, because I am going to the Father, where you can see me no longer; ¹¹ and about judgment, because the prince of this world now stands condemned.

¹² "I have much more to say to you, more than you can now bear. ¹³ But when he, the Spirit of truth, comes, he will guide you into all the truth. He will not speak on his own; he will speak only what he hears, and he will tell you what is yet to come. ¹⁴ He will glorify me because it is from me that he will receive what he will make known to you. ¹⁵ All that belongs to the Father is mine. That is why I said the Spirit will receive from me what he will make known to you."




