# **GREETINGS FROM PASTOR DAN**

## **Trust the Lord More in 2024**

Think of faith in Christ like a muscle. You were born with the muscles in your body. You did not choose them. They were given to you.

When you were baptized you were reborn into Christ. Through the power of God's Word in the water, you were given saving faith. You were given the ability to trust in Jesus.

Muscles need to be fed to grow and they need to be exercised in order to be strengthened. Your faith muscle is no different.

This means trusting God is an act of exercising the faith muscle given to you the day you were reborn. Certainly, it could be argued with adults that they receive this faith muscle simply through hearing God's Word and not rejecting it. Holy Baptism becomes that date where they know for sure they have this saving faith muscle.

You can try to trust in yourself. A common phrase we hear in our culture is "You have to believe in yourself." But when that is done outside of trusting in Jesus, sin will occur. It will show itself in doubt, anxiety, selfishness, lack of wisdom, and this will involve violating any number of the 10 Commandments.

This concept of trust, the actions of your faith, is embedded into God's Word: Proverbs 3:5-6 ESV:

Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and do not lean on your own understanding. In all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make straight your paths.

Forget New Years' resolutions. Have these verses be the vision for your life summed up in this phrase: **Trust the Lord more in 2024.** 

This involves constant engagement in God's Word where your faith is fed. This is why we offer a variety of group Bible Studies including a new Women's Bible Study starting on Thursday, January 18. This is why we have a Men's Group Bible Study the second Saturday morning of the month. This is why our adult Bible Studies are kept as podcasts for those who can't attend live on Tuesdays. It is also why we are constantly offering new member classes and have resources for personal devotion time. All this is good food including the weekly family meal offered during Divine Worship. Here is where our faith is nourished by hearing His Word as it is read, sung, proclaimed, confessed, and literally fed in the Lord's Supper.

Feeding your faith well is needed so that you can exercise it in the daily living as one of God's children.

As a congregation this faith will be exercised in discerning whether merging with Trinity and St John is a wise choice for our congregation. It will be exercised as we take the time to get to know new members coming in as we care for those who have been amongst us for years. This can be an incredibly powerful witness to others. Fear shows a faith muscle that is weak. Courage demonstrates a faith muscle that is strong.

Jesus feeds our faith with His love which drives away fear and fills us with His grace to forgive us, and set us on the right path with Him so we can trust Him more.

Jesus demonstrated His faith muscle is invincible when He gave up His life suffering and dying to get rid of all the bad to give us only His goodness shown in His physical resurrection from the dead. The Creator became the created to be the first-born of the New Creation, so we can absolutely trust in His hope of Heaven.

Now I can think of no better reason to "Trust the Lord more in 2024."

Louis and Brett were having coffee, the day after Christmas. Both shared with each other how much their families have changed, over the years. Children are talking about retirement. Grandchildren are out of college and advancing in their careers. Brett said to Louis, "When Sally and I put our estate plan together 25 years ago, we felt a great responsibility to provide for our family, as they seemed to have so many needs. But now our priorities are different, and our children are doing well. In fact, even our youngest grandchild is better off financially than I was at their age. But I do have a grandchild with special needs, and we are wondering what we should do for her. We also think a lot about our Church and its future as times are changing. We are also stirred by the LCMS missionary who talked about the impact of the Gospel on families over in Kenya. We know we need to update our plan, but it seems so complex and chaotic. We just do not know where to start."

Brett's predicament is common. Most people find that their life situations and the tug of the Gospel urge them to update their gift plans. We certainly live in an ever-changing world. It is therefore a good practice to review the gift plan within one's estate plan every so often, whenever you feel life has changed. That look may certainly bring some effort. But that is just good stewardship of God's things. We want to do well with God's gifts, to make sure our families see Jesus through our care for them, and the world sees Jesus through our support of ministry.

### **Church Supper Hot Dish**

#### **Ingredients:**

- 1 pound ground beef
- 2 cups sliced peeled potatoes
- 2 cups finely chopped celery
- 3/4 cup finely chopped carrots
- 1/4 cup finely chopped green pepper
- 1/4 cup finely chopped onion
- 2 tablespoons butter
- 1 cup water
- 2 cans (10-3/4 ounces each) condensed cream of mushroom soup, undiluted
- 1 can (5 ounces) chow mein noodles, divided
- 1 cup shredded cheddar cheese

#### **Directions:**

- Preheat oven to 350°. In a large skillet, cook beef over medium heat until no longer pink; drain and set aside.
- In same skillet, saute potatoes, celery, carrots, green pepper and onion in butter 5 minutes. Add water; cover and simmer 10 minutes or until vegetables are tender. Stir in soup and cooked ground beef until blended.
- Sprinkle half the chow mein noodles into a greased shallow 2-qt. baking dish. Spoon meat mixture over noodles. Cover and bake 20 minutes. Top with cheese and remaining noodles. Bake, uncovered, 10 minutes longer or until heated through.

#### What Each "Day" in "The 12 Days of Christmas" Means

- The partridge in a pear tree is Jesus Christ who was like a mother partridge, sacrificing herself to protect her young.
- The two turtle doves represent the Old and New Testaments.
- . The three French hens stand for faith, hope, and love.
- The four calling birds are the four gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John.
- The five golden rings represent the first five books of the Old Testament.
- The six geese a-laying stand for the six days of creation.
- The seven swans a-swimming are the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit.
- The eight maids a-milking represent the eight beatitudes, as Jesus expressed in the Sermon on the Mount from Matthew 5.
- The nine ladies dancing are nine expressions of the fruit of the Holy Spirit.
- The ten lords a-leaping stand for the Ten Commandments.
- The eleven pipers piping represent the eleven faithful Apostles.
- The twelve drummers drumming are for the twelve points of belief in The Apostles' Creed.
