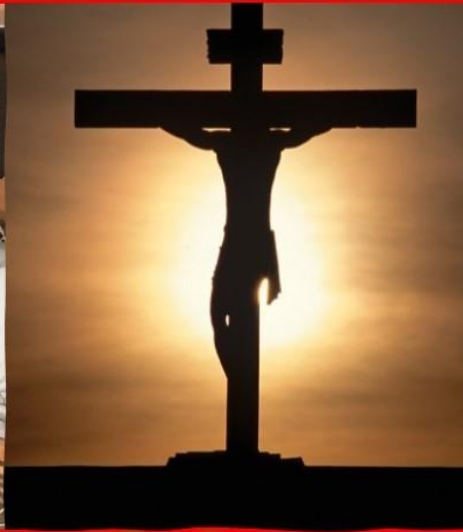


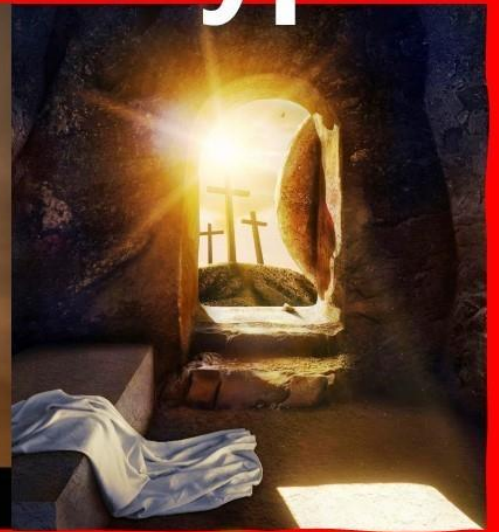

FROM THE LAY ELDER-DEACONS: Welcome to Messiah. We want to make sure your worship experience goes well. So just as a reminder, please turn cellphone ringers off during worship. Please remove hats, no earbuds, no gaming, no texting, and no social media. If you need to use your phone or have a conversation with someone, please excuse yourself from the sanctuary. Thank you.

FOR YOUR CONVENIENCE: Live audio of the worship service is available in the room that is just off the Narthex in the back of the sanctuary. This room has a bathroom and is a safe place for anxious children (or adults) to go and still be a part of the worship service.

PRAYER BEFORE WORSHIP: (Please pray silently) *O Heavenly Father, Your Son tells us that the worship of You is done in Truth and in Spirit. Bless our time together that the truth of Your Love will be revealed through the Holy Spirit. Thank You that we can worship together in one sanctuary. Let us leave here tonight filled with strengthened faith, and zeal to love others. In Jesus' Name, I pray. Amen*

OFFERING: *Please put your offering in the plates at the entrance. Thank you for your support.*

WORSHIP THEME: This night we celebrate God becoming flesh through the birth of our Lord and Savior by the virgin Mary. Tonight, we look at crib, a bed He was placed in after His birth. We meditate on how that humble beginning translated years later to the bed of death on the Cross and His victory over death, leaving His crypt. It is the complete Christmas story for you. We meditate on its beauty through the hope, peace, joy, and love of Jesus.

PRELUDE

WELCOME – WORSHIP THEME - GREETING PEOPLE IN THE NAME OF THE LORD

(If you are able, please stand)

Bible Verse of the Month: *Psalm 25:1 ESV*

CONFESSION OF SINS AND RECEIVING HOLY ABSOLUTION

P: O Lord, we come to You this night in humility. We are reminded that You humbly entered the world being born into poverty. As we look at our lives, we see how sin impoverishes us.

(Silence to meditate on the sins you have not brought before the Lord)

P: O Lord hear our prayer.

C: I confess to You that I lie in my bed of sins with my thoughts, through our words, and by our deeds. I commit iniquities against You even in my silence of failing to do Your will. There is so much sin in my life that there are transgressions I don't even realize I have committed. Please hear my prayer. Forgive my sins. Renew my faith, so I can live the complete Christmas story for You, every day. Amen.

P: The Son of the Father took on flesh and was laid in a humble crib. Years later He fulfilled His promise for you by being nailed to the bed of death, suffering and dying on the cross for you. He was laid in a crypt but did not stay in His tomb for long as He arose in victory. As a result, He offers you immortality through faith in Him, given to you in the waters of Holy Baptism. So, if this was your sincere confession then listen carefully as God has called me, one of His ordained servants to speak on His behalf and forgive you completely of all of your sins, in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen. Now Lord, I want to live a life of gratitude, showing others Your hope, peace, joy, and love, every day.



P: We invite one family member to bring their family candle to the altar at this time, to signify through the Church how the Holy Spirit uses us to spread our Light of Christ to others walking in darkness. If you do not have a candle there some you can borrow. They are located in the Narthex. ***Solo Hymn of Reflection from Berta Eddy.***

PRAYER FOR THE DAY/THE COLLECT

P: The Lord be with you.

C: And also with you.

P: Let us pray: *(A Moment of silence to reflect on the worship theme)* O heavenly Father, Your Son left Heaven to be born as the perfect version of us. Once He was born, He was laid in manger, a crib of humility. Tonight instill in us the full Christmas story to see how that infant bed led to His bed of death on the Cross, rising from His crypt to bring us hope, peace, joy, and love for our lives today. We pray this through Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior as You live and reign with Him, and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forevermore.

C: Amen.

THE HOPE SCRIPTURE READING.....1 Timothy 4:4-10 ESV

⁴ For everything created by God is good, and nothing is to be rejected if it is received with thanksgiving, ⁵ for it is made holy by the word of God and prayer.

⁶ If you put these things before the brothers, you will be a good servant of Christ Jesus, being trained in the words of the faith and of the good doctrine that you have followed. ⁷ Have nothing to do with irreverent, silly myths. Rather train yourself for godliness; ⁸ for while bodily training is of some value, godliness is of value in every way, as it holds promise for the present

life and also for the life to come. ⁹ The saying is trustworthy and deserving of full acceptance. ¹⁰ For to this end we toil and strive, because we have our hope set on the living God, who is the Savior of all people, especially of those who believe.

THE CHRISTMAS GOSPEL READING.....Luke 2:1-20 ESV

P: The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, the 2nd Chapter,

C: Glory to You, O Lord.

¹ In those days a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that all the world should be registered. ² This was the first registration when Quirinius was governor of Syria. ³ And all went to be registered, each to his own town. ⁴ And Joseph also went up from Galilee, from the town of Nazareth, to Judea, to the city of David, which is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and lineage of David, ⁵ to be registered with Mary, his betrothed, who was with child. ⁶ And while they were there, the time came for her to give birth. ⁷ And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in swaddling cloths and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.

⁸ And in the same region there were shepherds out in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night. ⁹ And an angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were filled with great fear. ¹⁰ And the angel said to them, "Fear not, for behold, I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. ¹¹ For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord. ¹² And this will be a sign for you: you will find a baby wrapped in swaddling cloths and lying in a manger." ¹³ And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God and saying,

¹⁵ When the angels went away from them into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let us go over to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has made known to us." ¹⁶ And they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby lying in a manger. ¹⁷ And when they saw it, they made known the saying that had been told them concerning this child. ¹⁸ And all who heard it wondered at what the shepherds told

them. ¹⁹ But Mary treasured up all these things, pondering them in her heart. ²⁰ And the shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them.

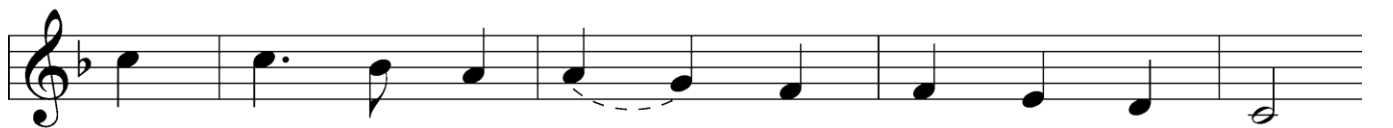
