PRAYER BEFORE WORSHIP: (Please pray silently) *O Heavenly Father, Your Son tells us that the worship of You is done in Truth and in Spirit. Bless our time together that the truth of Your Love will be revealed through the Holy Spirit. Thank You that we can worship together in one sanctuary. Let us leave here today filled with strengthened faith, and zeal to love others. In Jesus' Name, I pray. Amen.*

LITURGICAL SEASON: Christmas is the time of the liturgical year we celebrate the Son of God born incarnate as the only sinless human, Jesus Christ. The white paraments and stole signify the holiness of Jesus and how we are given His holiness by faith through His forgiveness.

WORSHIP THEME: This morning's Scripture readings point out how Christ is both our Creator and the created in the flesh of Jesus. His birth fulfills the Word of God in physical form, showing its power to create faith and convert hearts. As a result, He knows you well as both the One who created you in His Image and recreated you in Baptism. Therefore, He can identify with you as a human being with the struggles you face. Today, may the Lord as your Creator and Jesus as the created assure your heart that He knows you better than you know yourself, wants you to know Him better, and desires what is best for you.

P: The Lord God has heard your words. Now hear His Word full of His grace for you. God has called and ordained me as one of His servants of the Word to speak on His behalf these words of forgiveness for you. If you, as His baptized child, have spoken the truth of your sins then by the authority Jesus gives His Church, I forgive you completely of all of your sins in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

SERVICE OF THE WORD

THE OLD TESTAMENT READING.....Psalm 110:1-4 ESV

The Psalmist predicts the birth of the Messiah and one the bloodlines from which He shall come.

¹ The Lord says to my Lord:

“Sit at my right hand,
until I make your enemies your footstool.”

² The Lord sends forth from Zion
your mighty scepter.

Rule in the midst of your enemies!

THE EPISTLE READING.....Hebrews 1: 1-12 ESV

In this proclamation first given to the early Church's Jewish converts, the writer, inspired by the Holy Spirit, makes it clear that Jesus is God in the flesh.

¹ Long ago, at many times and in many ways, God spoke to our fathers by the prophets, ² but in these last days he has spoken to us by his Son, whom he appointed the heir of all things, through whom also he created the world. ³ He is the radiance of the glory of God and the exact imprint of his nature, and he upholds the universe by the word of his power. After making purification for sins, he sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high, ⁴ having become as much superior to angels as the name he has inherited is more excellent than theirs.

⁵ For to which of the angels did God ever say,

“You are my Son,
today I have begotten you”?

Or again,

“I will be to him a father,
and he shall be to me a son”?

⁶ And again, when he brings the firstborn into the world, he says,
"Let all God's angels worship him."

⁷ Of the angels he says,
"He makes his angels winds,
and his ministers a flame of fire."

⁸ But of the Son he says,
"Your throne, O God, is forever and ever,
the scepter of uprightness is the scepter of your kingdom.

⁹ You have loved righteousness and hated wickedness;
therefore God, your God, has anointed you
with the oil of gladness beyond your companions."

¹⁰ And,
"You, Lord, laid the foundation of the earth in the beginning,
and the heavens are the work of your hands;

¹¹ they will perish, but you remain;
they will all wear out like a garment,

¹² like a robe you will roll them up,
like a garment they will be changed.

But you are the same,
and your years will have no end."

P: The Holy Gospel according to the Apostle, St. John, the 1st Chapter,

¹ In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. ² He was in the beginning with God. ³ All things were made through him, and without him was not any thing made that was made. ⁴ In him was life, and the life was the light of men. ⁵ The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.

⁶ There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. ⁷ He came as a witness, to bear witness about the light, that all might believe through him. ⁸ He was not the light, but came to bear witness about the light.

⁹ The true light, which gives light to everyone, was coming into the world. ¹⁰ He was in the world, and the world was made through him, yet the world did not know him. ¹¹ He came to his own, and his own people did not receive him. ¹² But to all who did receive him, who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God, ¹³ who were born, not of blood nor of the will of the flesh nor of the will of man, but of God.

¹⁴ And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth. ¹⁵ (John bore witness about him, and cried out, "This was he of whom I said, 'He who comes after me ranks before me, because he was before me.'") ¹⁶ For from his fullness we have all received, grace upon grace. ¹⁷ For the law was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ. ¹⁸ No one has ever seen God; the only God, who is at the Father's side, he has made him known.
